History

This term the children will be learning all about the Romans. They will learn about the mythical and historical versions of the founding of Rome and place key Roman dates on an BC and AD timeline. To explain how Rome was ruled and governed and that the Roman Empire grew over time. To know the Roman army fought and conquered lands around the Mediterranean sea. To know who Boudicca was and describe her rebellion. The children will learn the hierarchy of Rome. To know that Julius Caesar's invasions of Britain in 55 and 54BC were unsuccessful but Emperor Claudius's invasion in AD43 was successful and resulted in Britain becoming Romanised. To describe how Britain became Romanised. To describe Roman crime and punishments.

PE:

Rounders:

They will learn what Christians mean by Trinity and know how they use prayers and hymns to remind them of the belief in the Trinity. They will find out what happened after the Ascension and explore why Mary is important in the Ascension story.

ENGLISH

We will be learning about the features of fiction and non fiction texts. In our non-fiction text, we will be writing a non-chronological report about an animal of their choosing.
