Update from Mrs Christopher

Dear Parents,

We are now almost 3 weeks into our Lenten journey and the staff and children have been **praying each day** for the people of Ukraine that they will be safe and have welcoming arms reaching out from all around the world. Pope Francis has asked us all to pray because prayer is a powerful entity all by itself. Please join us in spirit each day by saying our 'walking together' synodal prayer below every morning.

Our Pupil Chaplains in Y6 have been thinking ahead about how we can **help the people of Ukraine**. After a discussion, they have decided that they would like to raise money to support the Ukrainian refugees who come to this country. We have met with a representative from the Catholic Children's Society (CCS) and want to organise a sponsored walk event on Tuesday 29th March called 'Walk a mile in their shoes'. Please read the section below written by our pupil chaplains to find out more details.

Mental health and well being has been a prime topic of discussion at our school this half term. As well as referring to the 5 elements of mental health in assembly each week (as mentioned in the February newsletter and shown again below), we have created a simple mental health and well being 'vision statement' of what our school has to offer to support the mental health and well being of everyone in our school. At St Mary & St Joseph's we are:

- Ready to listen to each other
- Ready to support each other
- Ready to LOVE



One of the most important things for us all to remember is that we are never alone. As a Catholic school, we remind the children daily that Jesus is always there and is always ready to listen to us through prayer and through each other. As well as this, we have spoken to the children about how, in school, they can choose a trusted adult if they ever want to talk about something that is worrying them. The last few years have been very difficult for children as they have been exposed to the worries associated with COVID19, the current media coverage of war in Ukraine and the worries associated with the rising cost of living that will affect all families over the coming months. Good advice always includes the word 'listen'. If we listen, we will begin to understand their worries and we can support them and try to alleviate anxiety.

The children spent the day focusing on a particular text in class and teachers ensured there were lots of activities to complete around the chosen text.


Also, each class learnt a poem and which we performed to each other at the end of the school day to perform our class poems to the rest of the school.




If you are finding it difficult to get your child to read at home, please let the class teacher know so they can offer little incentives that may help.

Year 2 Greenpeace Visitor

On Monday 7th March, Sycamore class had a visit from Mr Doug Skinner, a local Greenpeace speaker from Swanage. He gave us a presentation all about how we can help protect our oceans. We learned that anchors can disturb seahorse habitats along Studland Bay so new Eco Buoys have been installed . He talked about how we can help by recycling and reusing plastics. Mr. Skinner explained how animals eat plastic thinking it is food. We were introduced to Ocean food chains and found out the names of the largest and smallest sea creatures. He brought along a Spider Crab to show us and some fishing nets. He showed us a picture of a whale washed up on the beach that had eaten lots of plastic. Year 2 are also currently having Forest school sessions on Fridays with Miss England. Year 5 investigated the effect of temperature on growing spring onions and dissected flowers. Year 1 have grown cress, whilst Year 2 have done a set of mini experiments with fruit. Year 3 and 4 had a great time learning about birds of prey with a live demonstration. Year 6 even grew slime! The week aims to raise the profile of science, celebrating the importance of it in our lives and learning about exciting the huge variety of exciting science careers.
