Accelerated Reader Word Count so far...

Everyone is reading, reading, reading with our new school system. It is great to see everyone reading for pleasure and taking quizzes at school and at home. The top reader of words is Leyna in Year 6 who has read 159,678 words so far with Ridley being the top word reader in Year 2 with 9,650 words, Stanley in St Mary & St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Newsletter Year 3 who was read a huge total of 10,472 words with Oliva in Year 4 reading a whopping 22,362 words and Neve C in Year 5 reading a massive 32,684 words all since the start of AR 2 weeks ago. Well done to everyone!

We also had a massive donation of children's books from a former student which was great to add to our reading material- so that was greatly appreciated.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE REQUESTS

It is essential that children form good habits of regular attendance at school from an early age and that good attendance is maintained throughout their school career. St Mary & St Joseph's is committed to working together to ensure that there is a consistent approach to school attendance. It is a legal requirement that all children should attend their educational provision and it is the parent/carer's responsibility to ensure that their children attend school.

St Mary and St Joseph's has agreed the following:

- It is important that pupils are in school on time. Time keeping is not only important in obtaining maximum benefit from education but is also a key skill for adult life. Lateness is monitored by the school and contributes to absence rates.
- St Mary & St Joseph's will monitor the attendance of our pupils and work closely with Dorset county council's School Attendance Service to support children whose attendance levels are causing concern.
- Whilst we understand that children do become ill on occasions, children who lose a lot of time at school can suffer in the long term from significant gaps in their learning. If a child's health continues to affect their education schools are obliged to make a referral to School Health to ensure that appropriate medical advice and support is provided.

• If a child is ill, it is the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure that they inform the school. St Mary & St Joseph's operates a targeted "First Day Call" system, which

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means if they have not received a message from you, they will contact you to ask why your child is not in school and when they are expected to return. If no contact is made then the Head teacher plus another staff member will complete a home visit.

- No leave of absence will be granted during term time, except in exceptional circumstances.
- We are therefore informing parents/carers that, should you wish to take your child out of school for any leave of absence, holidays or otherwise, the request will not be routinely granted. It is essential that any requests are made in writing in advance for the attention of the Head Teacher. Any absence which has not been authorised by St Mary & St Joseph's will be recorded as "unauthorised" and this has the potential to impact on your child's overall absence figure and could result in legal action.

St Mary & St Joseph's is committed to ensuring that every learner has the opportunity to thrive and achieve, and recognises that good attendance is central to this.
