For all children we provide:

- Quality First Teaching.
- A range of visual, auditory and kinaesthetic teaching styles such as 'Talk for Writing' and 'Kagan' learning strategies.
- Ongoing feedback and assessment including pink/ green marking, self/peer-reviewing and target setting.
- Resources available for children to access during independent work e.g. maths and literacy working walls, steps to success and physical maths resources such as number lines.
- Scaffolded work to aid accessibility.
- Access to technology to support learning e.g. iPads and laptops.
- Reading support:
 - Daily Phonics in KS1
 - Reading Group sessions KS2
- Adult support for group work.

Speech Language and Communication
